





the girl looked up. The old man looked down and said, 'I feel so old and frail.' The girl timidly replied, 'I feel so young and weak.'





'Whoever does righteousness, male or female, while believing, we will grant them a happy life...' 16:97





## 'I really wish I could walk fast like you,' said the old man to the rabbit.







...and sometimes I want what the other birds have."



'What do you mean?' replied the bird.


She gave a perplexed look and questioned, 'like where did we all come from?'

'l love you all,' the girl declared.


The bird flew high and called out, 'I like you too.'
